## History

The complex was built in the early 1960's by reknown architect Edward Durrell Stone, who also designed Radio City Music Hall and the Kennedy Center. It was one of the first buildings completed on the newly named Foster City and is located in Neighborhood 1. The Admiralty was originally built as apartment rentals and was named the Commodore Garden Apartments, a hip and trendy spot for the who's who of the Peninsula. It was also a popular home to many of the Bay Area's flight attendants, because of it's proximity to the airport. The clubhouse, pools and tennis courts used to be known as the Foster City Raquetball Club and the clubhouse used to house a restaurant and bar inside. Jack Foster was known to hold many functions there. Similarly designed buildings were built next door, known as the Sandpiper and Sandcastle Apartments. Admiralty, Sandpiper and Sandcastle share the clubhouse, pools and tennis courts per an agreement put into affect by Jack Foster.

The complex was later converted to co-op units and is now a condominium complex.

## Amenities

Some of the amenities our residents enjoy, include: Access to two swimming pools, two tennis courts, a large clubhouse with kitchen, close proximity to City Hall, Fire and Police, walking distance to the Jewish Community Center, parks and the local library, convenient distance to shopping and Bridgepointe mall.

We are also across the street from the future Foster City downtown village square along Foster City Blvd. and the Triton/Pilgrim redevelopment project along Hillsdale Blvd. Read more about these project on the Foster City website .

## Directions and Location

The Admiralty complex is conveniently located at the entrance to the residential portion of Foster City, across from City Hall, and at the corner of Hillsdale Blvd. and Foster City Blvd. Along the backside, the complex is fronted by Comet Drive.

From Highway 101, take 92 East and then take the Foster City Blvd. exit, which is the last Foster City exit before you end up on the San Mateo Bridge. At the exit (facing Orchard Supply Hardware), you will turn left and then immediately turn right at the stop light. Go straight for about a block and you'll see the Admiralty complex on your left. The complex is located roughly 2 minutes from Hwy. 92, four minutes from Hwy. 101, 10 minutes from Hwy. 280 and about 15 minutes from San Francisco International Airport. It also runs along a major bus route, that can bring you to CalTrain and BART.
